What is an academy?

- Academies receive funding directly from the government and are run by an academy trust.
- Academies have more autonomy over how they do things than community schools.
- Academies are inspected by Ofsted.
- They have to follow the same rules on admissions, special educational needs and exclusions as other state schools and pupils sit the same exams/tests.





Reasons we are considering academy status

- Our core consideration is to ensure the best outcomes for the children, families and staff of Irby Primary School.
- We recognise the need for structured, focused collaboration amongst schools and practitioners that will facilitate constant positive change resulting in improved outcomes for all children and their families.
- ▶ We seek to enhance the future of Irby Primary School by securing the support of an effective and successful MAT; which will provide high quality training and collaboration for all staff; drawing on in-house expertise across a number of high performing schools.
- ► A MAT can provide our school with financial support (e.g. economies of scale when purchasing) and access to central funding (e.g. for building repairs).

In light of the current political agenda, to select the right MAT at the right time for Irby Primary School.

Having been through a process of due diligence in exploring all the support on offer and identifying a means of achieving the school's aims to meet aspirational goals for children and their families, we believe it is appropriate to secure the future for Irby Primary by committing to Oak Trees Multi Academy Trust now.
