NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS - READING

As we start the New Year we ask all parents and carers to support their children's education through taking the time to read with them regularly. We expect all children to read 5 times per week for at least 10-15mins to practise the skills taught in school through all aspects of the curriculum including English and guided reading.

If a child reads for significantly more that 10 minutes please feel free to write the number of minutes (rounded to the nearest ten) asnd staff will record the appropriate number of sessions (e.g. 30 mins = 3 sessions).

Reading not only supports academic progress but is a key catalyst for the development of self-esteem and supports mental health and wellbeing. It drives all aspects of language acquisition (e.g. spelling, writing, phonics) and allows children to access all other subjects.
